

Nursing and Allied Health is pleased to announce the Radiologic Technologist program will be available this fall! The RT program is an Associate of Science degree program consisting of a cohort group completing four (4) semesters and one (1) summer semester.

Radiologic Technologists specialize in x-ray and computed tomography (CT) imaging. They perform x-rays and other diagnostic imaging exams on patients to assist in diagnosing injuries and illnesses.
