## Don Domenigoni

Member, MSJC Foundation Board of Directors

Mr. Domenigoni is a hometown success story and a true MSJC Eagle. He graduated from Hemet High in 1972 and then from MSJC, with a major in biology, in 1974. He served as Alumni President dating back to the 1970s. He graduated from California State Polytechnic Pomona in 1978 with a Bachelor of Science Degree. During his career with the Riverside County Agricultural Department, Mr. Domenigoni continued to support educational activities and in 1993, he joined the MSJC Foundation Board. He has served as the board's President, and chaired the Alumni, Scholarship, Nominating and Development committees, and served on the special events committee. We thank Mr. Domenigoni for his dedication to MSJC and his leadership over many decades.

## MSJC ATHLETICS HALL OF FAME INDUCTEES

#### 1999 Football Team

The 1999 football team finished the season 10-1 overall and were the undefeated champions of the Foothill Conference. The team ended the year with a victory in the Mission Bowl against Mt. SAC and finished the season ranked #8 in the country by JC Gridwire. David Minnich was named the Conference's Offensive Player of the Year while Kevin Boyd earned the Defensive Player of the Year honor. 18 players in all earned all-conference recognition, with several of them also earning All-Region honors.

## John Norman

John Norman was an All-Conference and All-State quarterback for MSJC and led the team to a conference championship in 1975. Norman, who played both high school and junior college football for MSJC Hall of Fame Coach Bob Stengel, earned a scholarship to Oregon State University. Since returning to the area Norman has been heavily involved in the community, which included teaching and coaching at MSJC for 10 years as both an assistant football and head tennis coach. Beyond his coaching and teaching roles John has served on the Board of Trustees for the San Jacinto Unified School District as well as the Board for the Valley Restart Shelter.

### Jamaal Tinsley

Tinsley led the Eagles to the state championship game during his sophomore season for MSJC in 1999. He was the Foothill Conference Player of the Year as well as being named First Team All-State. He earned a scholarship to Iowa State University where he helped the Cyclones to the NCAA Tournament's Elite Eight and was the Big 12 Player of the Year. He was the 27th pick in the first round of the 2001 NBA draft and went on to play 11 seasons in the league.

### Ken Reed

Ken Reed has been an invaluable part of the MSJC athletic department for the past 50 plus years. The long-time teacher and coach at San Jacinto High started his association with MSJC back in the 1960's as a member of the Eagle baseball team. He has helped the department with score keeping, public address announcing, and fund raising among countless other things. Ken has been an active service member throughout the community most notably with the San Jacinto Lions Club. He spearheaded the launch of the San Jacinto Lions Club Tip-Off Classic for women's basketball which began in 2012.
