To <u>provide a clear & concise information</u> on key student progress & success metrics in order to improve performance


Student Success Scorecard Metrics

- Persistence research shows that students with sustained enrollment are more likely to succeed
- 2. At least 30 units tend to be positively correlated with completion & wage gain
- 3. <u>Completion</u> Completed a **degree**, **certificate** or related outcomes
- 4. Remedial Started below transfer level in English, math and /or ESL & completed a college-level course in the same discipline
- 5. <u>Career Technical Education</u> Completed several courses classified as career technical in a single discipline & completed a degree, certificate or transferred

1. Persistence

% of degree and/or transfer-seeking students tracked for six years through 2011-12 who enrolled in the first three consecutive terms.


Research shows that students with sustained enrollment are more likely to succeed.



2. At least 30 Units


% of degree and/or transfer seeking students tracked for 6 years through 2011-12 who achieved at least 30 units.

Credit accumulation, 30 units specifically, **tend to be positively correlated with completion and wage gain**.




3. Completion


% of degree and/or transfer-seeking students tracked for six years through 2011-12 who completed a degree, certificate or transfer related outcomes.



4. Remedial


% of credit students tracked for 6 years through 2011-12 who started below transfer level in English, math, and/or ESL and completed a college-level course in the same discipline.





5. Career Technical Education (CTE)

% of students tracked for 6 years through 2011-12 who completed several courses classified as career technical education in a single discipline & completed a degree, certificate or transferred.



Student Success Scorecard

- In CCC Board of Governors commitment to increase transfer and degree and certificate attainment established a performance measurement that tracks student success at all 112 community colleges.
- The scorecard represents an unprecedented level of transparency and accountability on student progress and success metrics.
- The scorecard tell how well colleges are doing in remedial instruction, job training programs, retention of students and graduation and completion rates.
- Data reported by **gender, age and ethnicity**, colleges, students and the public can also better determine if colleges are narrowing achievement gaps, which is vitally important for our students and our state's economy.



MSJC... improvement in 4 of the 5 measurements

- Student progress & achievement rate
- Percent of students who earned 30 units
- annual successful course completion rate for vocational courses
- Credit basic skills completion
- ESL Improvement Rates
- Due primarily to the expansion of <u>student success initiatives</u> three years ago coupled with a major emphasis on professional development among faculty.
- <u>Interventions</u> made a difference.
 - Supplemental Instruction (SI)
 - Learning Communities
 - First Year Experience
 - o Strategies and interventions rooted in the college's STEM grant
 - o The ESL program indicator is trending up due to much focused planning in this area.
- The <u>persistence rate</u> did not show improvement after hitting 67% in 2008-2009 and declining to 64%.
 - o This will become an action item for improvement with the instruction and student service divisions.
- Despite the challenge of the state budget reductions, MSJC is making every effort to <u>minimize the impact</u> of these constraints on student access and success.
