**WHEN TO USE THE IGETC PATTERN:**

IGETC can be used towards all Associate Degrees for Transfer (ADTs) and other transfer degrees at MSJC. These degrees require a minimum of 60 semester CSU or UC transferable units with a minimum overall GPA of 2.0 and a minimum of 18 units within a specific [transfer degree major](#). Please confirm minimum California State University (CSU) or University of California (UC) requirements for specific majors and programs. Students can refer to [ASSIST](#) for CSU or UC major preparation and confirm minimum CSU and UC requirements for specific majors and programs.

GRADE POINT AVERAGE

Completion of all IGETC requirements with a grade of "C" (C- is not acceptable) or better will permit a student to transfer from a California Community College (CCC) to a CSU, UC, out-of-state or Private institution. UC transferable admission eligibility requires a minimum of 60 UC transferable semester units with a minimum overall G.P.A. of 2.4 (although many UCs require a higher GPA).

Application for IGETC Certification

IGETC Certification is completed by the CCC that the student is transferring from. Full certification of lower division IGETC is met by completion of all general education areas. Students can apply for IGETC Certification through [Enrollment Services](#). A minimum of 37 semester units in AREAS 1-7 are required for full certification of lower-division general education requirements.

IGETC for STEM is (partial certification) only allowed for an approved STEM Associate Degree for Transfer (ADT) Degree. Students must confirm the CSU or UC major, program, or college that they are applying to accept **partial IGETC certification**. Although IGETC for STEM is an option, students should prioritize completing major-preparation courses for the specific campuses and programs they are considering.

IGETC for STEM (31 units): Only permitted for an approved Associate Degree for Transfer (ADT Degree). The IGETC for STEM can **only** be applied to the **Biology, Chemistry and Environmental Science ADT Degrees**. The IGETC for STEM requires:

- **AREA 1:** 9 semester units/12 quarter units; one course from 1A, one course from 1B, and one course from 1C (for students transferring to a CSU and/or students working towards an ADT)
- **AREA 2:** 3 semester units/4 quarter units by selecting one course
- **AREA 3:** 6 semester units/9 quarter units; one course from 3A and one course from 3B
- **AREA 4:** 3 semester units/4 quarter units by selecting one course
- **AREA 5:** 7 semester units/9 quarter units; one course from 5A, one course from 5B, and one course from 5C if not met in 5A/5B
- **AREA 6:** meeting Language other than English (LOTE) competency (for UC schools)
- **AREA 7:** 3 semester units/ 4 quarter units by selecting one course

DOUBLE COUNTING

Double counting within IGETC is not allowed. Although a course may be listed in more than one subject area, a single course may be used just once.

Courses Taken at Foreign Institutions

Foreign coursework may be applied to IGETC if the foreign institution has United States regional accreditation. All other foreign coursework cannot be applied to IGETC. Exception: Language Other Than English (LOTE).

PROFICIENCY IN A LANGUAGE OTHER THAN ENGLISH

Students can certify LOTE with high school transcripts that indicate completion of course work equivalent to two years or second level foreign language of the same foreign language. A grade of C- or better in high school is required in the second semester of the second level. Students can also meet this requirement by completing a higher-level foreign language course with a grade C- or better in the second semester. Students can also apply AP Language Exams towards LOTE with a score of 3, 4, or 5.

AP SCORES

AP scores of 3, 4, or 5 can be used to satisfy any IGETC subject area where acceptable. Please refer to the [MSJC AP Chart](#) to confirm how exams can be applied.

IB SCORES

A score of 5, 6 or 7 on Higher Level exams is required to grant credit for IGETC certification. An acceptable IB score for IGETC equates to either 3 semester or 4 quarter units for certification purposes. Students who have earned credit from an IB exam should not take a comparable college course as transfer credit cannot be granted for both. Please see an MSJC Counselor for approved courses.

Every effort is made to keep this information current. Transfer and articulation are ongoing processes and courses are subject to changes on this option.
