ONLINE LEARNING

Online Real-Time are classes with required, scheduled, live online meetings to provide simultaneous interaction with the instructor and other students in real time.

Online Anytime are classes that are available on your own time, 24/7 via Canvas. Interaction with the instructor and other students may take place through discussion boards, group assignments, email, and other means. While instructors may offer optional Zoom sessions, there are no required real-time meetings.

Blended courses offer a combination of Online Real-Time and Online Anytime components. There will be required, scheduled, live online meetings, and more flexible instruction that is available on your own time.

Hybrid courses are a combination of face-to-face and online. Courses such as nursing and automotive require some face-to-face meetings, for example.

CAREER EDUCATION-

ADMINISTRATION OF JUSTICE

The Administration of Justice and Corrections program prepares students to earn a certificate, associate degree or associate degree for transfer to a four-year university. The program is designed to prepare students for entry into various careers within the criminal justice field at the federal, state, county or municipal levels. This includes police officer, deputy sheriff, probation/parole officer or corrections officer. Courses include working with the latest equipment and technology: use-of-force and driving simulators, 3D laser crime scene and collision reconstruction scanners, forensics equipment and computerized composite sketching software.

AUTOMOTIVE TECHNOLOGY

The Automotive Technology program at MSJC emphasizes a real-world approach to diagnostic skill building and a thorough understanding of system theory and operations. This is accomplished using computer programs, audiovisual aids, instructor-led demonstration and hands-on experience, such as state-of-the-art simulators, mock-ups and modern vehicles.

AVIATION SCIENCE

Aviation Science prepares students to become professional pilots or flight operations specialists. The program can be tailored to meet the needs of individual students and is designed for students without any flying experience.

BUSINESS ADMINISTRATION

MSJC's Business Administration program offers various degree and certificate pathways including an associate degree, associate degree for transfer, and certificates, including an employment concentration in project management.

COMPUTER SCIENCE INFORMATION SYSTEMS/CYBER SECURITY

CSIS offers students a well-equipped technical environment for both instruction and lab. All CSIS courses are taught in computer-equipped classrooms, allowing hands-on experience in the use of industry standard hardware, application software, operating systems, networking and programming tools. In addition to the CSIS degree, MSJC offers focused, specialized areas of study in networking, Internet authoring, programming and others.

CREATIVE MEDIA

Creative Media students learn hands-on industryready skills in video production, visual effects, audio, photography, web design or social media marketing to get started in the expanding digital media field. Students have access to cutting-edge equipment, with courses taking place in both classrooms and professional live-streaming studios.



CULINARY ARTS

The Culinary Arts certificate program provides training in both culinary and baking and pastry. Our state-of-the-art kitchen and robust curriculum ensure students will learn the skills necessary for employment in many food-service kitchens.

ENGINEERING TECHNOLOGY

The program is committed to providing a great start for people who want to get straight to work in engineering and related fields or continue their engineering education. You may work toward any engineering field, including civil, architectural, electrical/electronics, mechanical, and manufacturing.

GEOSPATIAL INFORMATION SCIENCE (GIS)/DRONE

GIS provides students with a framework for gathering, managing, and analyzing data. GIS analyzes spatial location and organizes layers of information into visualizations using different kinds of map images and incorporating 2D and 3D scenes.

NURSING AND ALLIED HEALTH

MSJC offers many career options in the health field. Some require one or two semesters to complete, such as emergency medical technician (EMT). Others, including diagnostic medical sonography (DMS), take four semesters. Within the Nursing and Allied Health program, the career-ladder approach to education enables students to set short-and/or long-term attainable goals. MSJC's Nursing program continues to rank among the top programs in the state and nation with consistently higher National Council Licensing Exam pass rates than most schools, ranging between 95% and 100%. The job market for Registered Nurses is forecast to grow nationwide, and nursing graduates secure employment in our region.

VITICULTURE, ENOLOGY & WINERY

The science of making wine, wine hospitality and soil analysis are among the studies available for certificates.



STUDENT LIFE-

MSJC offers students enriching opportunities that go beyond the typical two-year college experience. Student Life is bustling with clubs and a host of activities each month, including student BBQs, homecoming events and more.

The MSJC Athletics Department features 12 intercollegiate sports teams; seven women's and five men's teams.

In women's athletics, the Eagles participate in basketball, golf, soccer, softball, tennis, and beach and indoor volleyball. The men compete in baseball, basketball, football, golf and tennis.

Among the MSJC alumni in the professional sports arena is former NBA first round draft choice Jamaal Tinsley. MSJC student-athletes continue to matriculate at a rapid rate as former Eagles are spread out across the country with a combined total of more than \$1 million in scholarships.

On the fields and courts, the Eagles have had tremendous success with numerous post-season appearances, multiple conference championships and the 2018 state title in women's basketball.

TRANSFER TO A UNIVERSITY

Transfer WITH A guarantee


The Associate Degree for Transfer (A.A.-T or A.S.-T) or ADT guarantees students will meet the California State University (CSU) system minimum eligibility requirements. Students earning an ADT will be admitted to a CSU (not necessarily to a particular campus or major). You may be granted a bump in your GPA when applying to an impacted campus outside your local area or an impacted major that is deemed similar.

If you are admitted and enrolled in a designated similar degree program, you can complete your bachelor's degree with as little as 60 semester units or 90 quarter units of coursework. A counselor will help you determine which CSUs offer bachelor's degrees that correspond to your ADT.

It is still important for you to apply to the schools that interest you and follow admissions deadlines to be considered.

TAG agreements may also guarantee admission to some University of California (UC) system colleges upon completion of a contract developed between the student and a four-year representative from the respective university. Agreements do not guarantee admission to the major of your choice.

If you are a Dreamer or DACA recipient, complete the DREAM Act Application at **dream.csac.ca.gov** (for undocumented students).

STEP 3 ORIENTATION

Complete the online orientation that is designed to introduce students to the policies, procedures and services offered at MSJC.

STEP 4 COUNSELING

Counselors can assist students in academic, career and personal counseling. Schedule an appointment with a counseling during your 1st semester to complete your pathway to success.

STEP 5 REGISTRATION

You are now ready to register for your courses once you receive your first semester educational plan via email.

STEP 6 ATTEND

All registration fees need to be paid once you register.
