This has been an exciting year for the Mt. San Jacinto College (MSJC) Foundation. We've spent considerable time carefully revising our focus, setting new goals, and planning our strategy to better support the college district and the students. Today, those plans are yielding outcomes that can further MSJC's Legacy of Transformation for generations to come.

We are honored that HCN Bank has become our first naming rights partner. As Superintendent/President Dr. Roger Schultz said in his message, by naming the new stadium at the Menifee Valley Campus the HCN Bank Stadium, the bank is affirming its trust in MSJC and making an investment that will support the college district and its students.

These are major achievements that come as major milestones in our journey: MSJC is celebrating its 60th anniversary and the MSJC Foundation is celebrating its 40th anniversary.

This is a great time to share with you where the MSJC Foundation has been and where it's headed. The MSJC Foundation was formed in 1983 to support student success and the college's initiatives. It is managed by community leaders who volunteer to work with college staff to meet the needs of the college district. As a nonprofit, 501(c)3, we have provided more than \$3.5 million in scholarships and other support over the last 40 years. We've provided mini grants to students and faculty and offered

assistance through programs like the Student Success Funds, made possible through funds raised from private and public sectors.

Four years ago, we understood it was time to redefine how we can better serve the district. We decided to move from solely a scholarship-granting auxiliary to one that leverages its alumni base and its relationships with the community to secure a strong financial future through development and other fundraising opportunities. We understand that MSJC students and the district will need continued support to fill in the gaps when unforeseen circumstances arise.

In this annual report you will learn how the Foundation supports college events, fosters community partnerships and helps students reach their goals. You'll also learn more about opportunities to show your support.

We are so pleased that HCN Bank made this historic investment in our college district. 
MSJC and HCN Bank Announce Historic Stadium Naming Rights Sponsorship

Mt. San Jacinto College, the MSJC Foundation, and HCN Bank announced a historic \$1 million naming rights and sponsorship agreement, making the new stadium at the Menifee Valley Campus the HCN Bank Stadium. This 10-year agreement is the largest and first of its kind in MSJC's history. The 5,000-seat stadium, part of the Athletics & Kinesiology Complex, will host Eagles football and women's soccer, as well as community events and concerts.

As part of the agreement, HCN Bank will collaborate with MSJC to empower students through financial literacy workshops, scholarship opportunities, and career development support. "We are thrilled to partner with HCN Bank, an organization that shares our values and commitment to education and community needs," said Dr. Roger Schultz, Superintendent/President of MSJC. "Their investment in our new stadium will provide our students and residents throughout the Southwest Riverside County region with an exceptional facility and foster a sense of pride and unity within our community. We look forward to working together with HCN Bank to expand educational opportunities and empower our students to achieve their full potential."

2023 Hall of Fame Inductees and Foundation Honorees

The MSJC Athletics Department and the MSJC Foundation honored Athletics Hall of Fame inductees and Foundation honorees during the Hall of Fame and Recognition Ceremony. The event, hosted by the MSJC Foundation, took place at the newly named HCN Bank Stadium on the Menifee Valley Campus, celebrating the achievements and contributions of these distinguished individuals.



Jamaal Tinsley, led the Eagles to the state championship game during his sophomore year in 1999. He was the Foothill Conference Player of the Year as well as being named First Team All-State. He earned a scholarship to lowa State University and was named the Big 12 Player of the Year. He went on to play in the NBA for the Indiana Pacers, Memphis Grizzlies, LA D-Fenders, and Utah Jazz.



The 1999 Eagles football team, which finished the season 10-1 overall, were the undefeated champions of the Foothill Conference, and ranked #8 in the country. Eighteen players in all earned recognition, with several of them also earning All-Region honors.



John Norman, an All-Conference and All-State quarterback for MSJC led the team to a conference championship in 1975. Norman later taught and coached at MSJC, serves on the Board of Trustees for the San Jacinto Unified School District, and has remained active in his community.



Don Domenigoni (center), an MSJC alumnus, has served on the MSJC Foundation board since 1993 in various roles, including board president. He was honored for his commitment by First Vice President Dr. Alisha Wilkins (left) and Board President Adam Eventov (right). His dedication exemplifies the strong leadership within the foundation, supporting MSJC's mission to enhance educational opportunities.

Ken Reed has been part of MSJC's Athletics Department for 50 years. He began as a baseball player, later assisted with scorekeeping, served as an announcer, and helped raise funds for the department. Reed remains actively involved in his community.

Dedication Ceremony for New Athletics & Kinesiology Complex

On September 5, MSJC celebrated the grand opening of its state-of-the-art Athletics & Kinesiology Complex with a dedication ceremony attended by college officials, faculty, staff, local leaders, and community members. The \$50 million complex at the Menifee Valley Campus features a 30,722-square-foot stadium, beach volleyball court, softball field, training facilities, and community gathering spaces. "The complex is our most recent achievement that will transform our college district and our region," Superintendent/President Dr. Roger Schultz said, "We are honored to be a point of pride for Menifee, the surrounding communities, and the county of Riverside." Vicki Carpenter, Board of Trustee member stated, "I walked across it (the field), and I could feel the energy." Local leaders, including Menifee Mayor Bill Zimmerman, also shared their excitement, calling the opening day a historic milestone for the community.


