Mt. San Jacinto Community College Student Right-to-Know Rates for Fall 2014 Cohort

Completion Rate: 23.14 %

Transfer Rate: 11.68 %

In compliance with the Student-Right-to-Know and Campus Security Act of 1990(Public Law 101-542), it is the policy of our college district to make available its completion and transfer rates to all current and prospective students. Beginning in Fall 2014, a cohort of all certificate, degree, and transfer-seeking first-time, full-time students were tracked over a three year period. Their completion and transfer rates are listed above. These rates do not represent the success rates of the entire student population at the College nor do they account for student outcomes occurring after this three year tracking period.

Based upon the cohort defined above, a Completer is a student who attained a certificate or degree or became 'transfer prepared' during a three year period, from Fall 2014 to Spring 2017. Students who have completed 60 transferable units with a GPA of 2.0 or better are considered 'transfer-prepared'. Students who transferred to another post-secondary institution, prior to attaining a degree, certificate, or becoming 'transfer-prepared' during a five-semester period, from Spring 2015 to Spring 2017, at transfer students.

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Form 1098-T. In compliance with IRS regulations, MSJC reports information about student tuition paid in excess of scholarships and waivers during the calendar year. To be eligible to receive a 1098-T, students must have made eligible tuition payments and have a valid SSN on record with the college.
